It shall be the policy of ISTC that protective devices required by Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), shall be provided to and used by students, faculty, and visitors.

Public School Laws
Title 52, § 1 (12)

§ 1 (12). Eye Protective devices for pupils and teachers participating in certain courses—
(a) every pupil and every teacher in the public schools shall wear industrial quality eye protection devices while participating in the following courses:

- A. Vocational or industrial arts, shops, or laboratories involving experience with:
 - 1. Hot molten metals,
 - 2. Milling, sawing, turning, shaping, cutting, or stamping of any solid materials,
 - 3. Heat treatment, tempering, or kiln firing of any metal or other materials,
 - 4. Gas or electric arc welding,
 - 5. Repair or servicing of any vehicle,
 - 6. Caustic or explosive materials;

- B. Chemical or combined chemical-physical laboratories involving caustic or explosive chemicals or hot liquids or solids.
 - (b) The board of education or other governing authority of each school shall furnish the eye protective devices prescribed in this section free of charge to the pupils and teachers or the school participating in the courses described in subsection (a) of this section. The county board of education or other governing authority shall furnish eye protective devices to all visitors to the courses heretofore named.

 - (c) “Industrial quality eye protective devices” as used in this section shall mean devices meeting the current standards of the American standard safety ode for head, eye, and respiratory protection, promulgated by the American Standards Association, Incorporated.
